**Students, faculty, and staff attend emergency preparedness sessions**

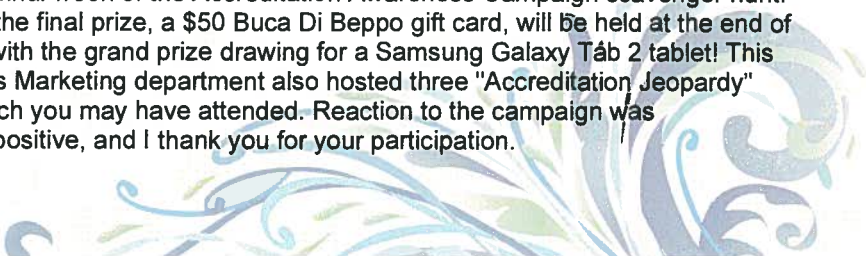

The session served as a refresher course on NIMS, SEMS, Campus Operations Centers (COCs), and overall coordinated response in the event of a disaster on- or off-campus. 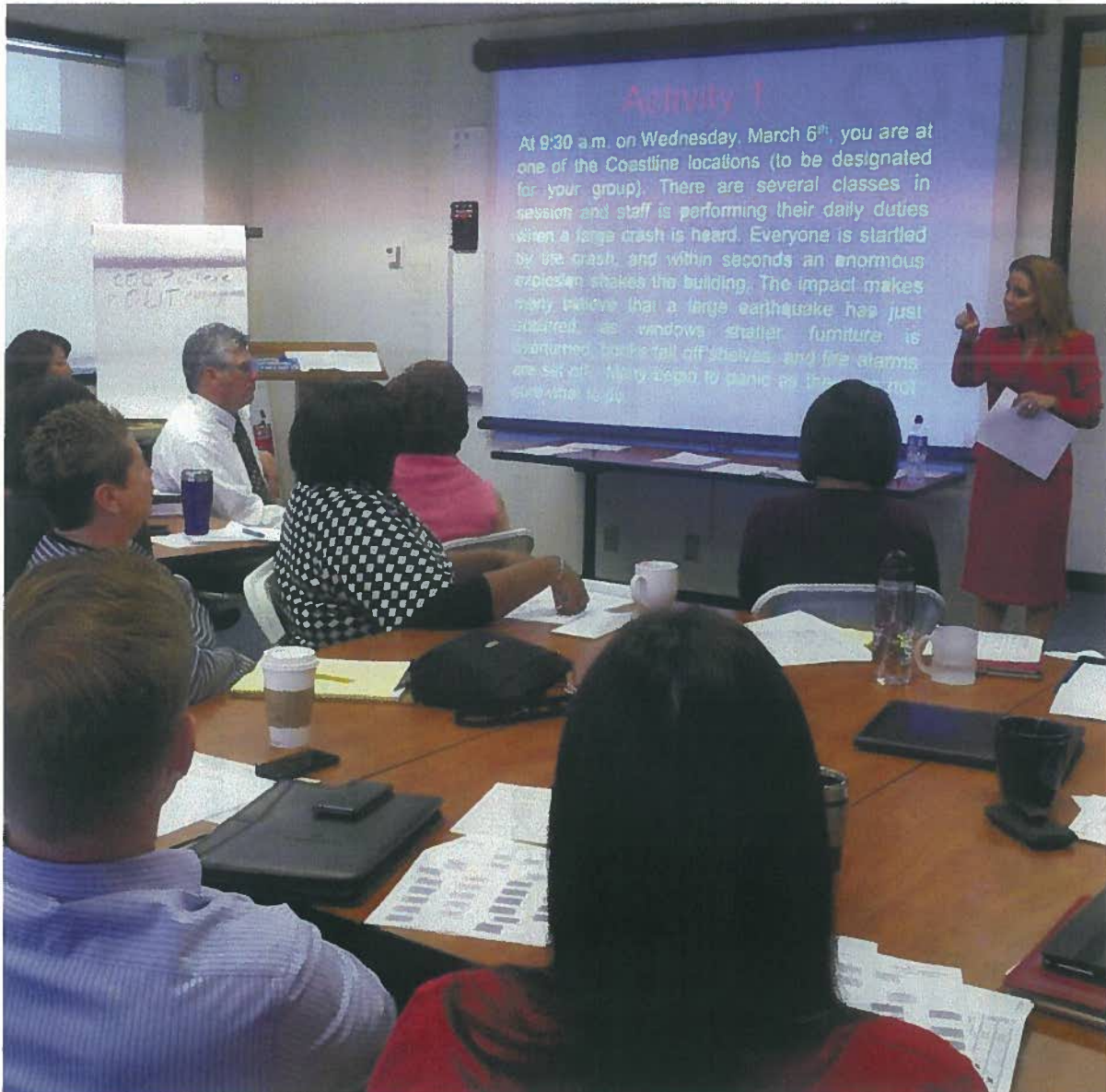
