Campus safety discussion and training scheduled for April 26

Due to several recent tragedies, there is heightened interest in discussions, planning, and exercises related to campus safety nationwide. To respond, Coastline has invited Teresa Irvin to present at the Spring Workshop on April 26. Teresa is a PT instructor in the Coastline Emergency Management Program and has twenty years of law enforcement experience. She is a subject matter expert in first responder contact with mental illness, crisis communication and handling critical incidents. At this special workshop, attendees will be introduced to a variety of strategies to approach students or colleagues exhibiting signs and symptoms of at risk behavior. Participants will also learn communication techniques for verbally de-escalating individuals of concern. In addition, attendees will learn how to set appropriate expectations and the importance of collaboration among faculty, staff, and students to promote a safe and secure college environment.

At the conclusion of the workshop, attendees will be able to:

1. Recognize the signs/symptoms of students of concern and remove the fear of reporting.
2. Utilize verbal communication techniques to de-escalate a situation.
3. Share the information and recognize the importance of collaboration between all parties involved.

The faculty should create a comfortable and a congenial classroom or on-line environment conducive to learning, exhibit a contagious enthusiasm for the subject being taught, clearly set forth both the objectives of the course and the methods of assessing student achievement, teach *how* rather than *what* to think, and encourage student participation in reaching conclusions.

Both a full time and part time instructor will be honored at the Academic Senate's May 21st lunch.

The faculty selected for this year's Teacher of the Year awards will be eligible for the Coast District's nomination for the Orange County Teacher of the Year award for 2015-2016.
