**JIM MORENO ELECTED PRESIDENT OF COAST COMMUNITY  
COLLEGE DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

Huntington Beach resident former County of Los Angeles Deputy Supervisor Jim Moreno has been elected to serve to as the president of the Coast Community College District (CCCD) Board of Trustees for 2012. Moreno was unanimously elected board president by his fellow trustees at an organizational meeting this week. Trustee Mary Hornbuckle was elected vice president and Trustee Lorraine Prinsky was reelected to the Clerk position.

Moreno has served on the Coast Community College District Board of Trustees since 2006. This is his second term as president. He currently resides in Trustee Area 1, which includes Huntington Beach, Seal Beach and Westminster.

During his career on the Board, Moreno has served on the Audit Committee, chaired the Career and Technical Education Committee and been the trustee representative to the Orange County Community Colleges Legislative Task Force and the District Foundation. Moreno also serves on the Community College League of California's Advisory Committee on Education Services and is an elected representative to the California Community Colleges Trustee Board.

Reelected to the board last year, Moreno has also served his community as the Past Chairman of the Citizen Participation Advisory Board for the City of Huntington Beach, the past Senior Deputy for a Los Angeles County Supervisor, a volunteer at the Live Oak Adult Literacy Program teaching English and Citizenship and as a Member of CHP Community Advisory Board. Moreno is a graduate of California State University, Long Beach.

"I am honored to serve again as president of the board," Moreno said. "We are facing important challenges at our colleges and increasing budget cuts from the state. We need to find ways to fully fund our colleges and continue to provide pathways for our students to attain their educational goals."

Vice President Mary Hornbuckle represents Trustee Area 4, which includes Costa Mesa. Hornbuckle was a member of the Costa Mesa City Council from 1984 until 1996 and is the current director of St. Mark's Preschool in Costa Mesa. Hornbuckle has been inducted into the Orange Coast College Hall of Fame, was named Woman of the Year by the Costa Mesa Chamber of Commerce and was the recipient of the Orange County Human Relations Commission Award. Hornbuckle serves on the Board's Accreditation Committee and the Audit and Budget Committee.

Clerk of the Board, Dr. Lorraine Prinsky represents Trustee Area 3, which includes parts of Huntington Beach and Fountain Valley. A retired Professor of Sociology at California State University, Fullerton. Prinsky also serves as a Mediator for Orange County Human Relations and Community Service Programs in Orange County Small Claims Courts and is a Professor for the American Institute for Foreign Study. Prinsky serves on the Board's Legislative Affairs Committee, Personnel Committee and the Accreditation Committee. Prinsky is also the current representative to the Orange County Legislative Task Force.
